Second in the series! Still Life Drawing Sunday, October 9, from 2 to 3:30 pm. Pre-register to receive the zoom workshop link. Introduction to Still Life Drawing will cover drawing static objects (things that do not move such as fruit or flowers). Participants should plan to attend with some items found around the home or in the yard that they want to try drawing. Items such as leaves, flowers, whole fruit, or shells make good still life subjects. Please come to the zoom with paper (drawing paper or white copy paper), pencils, colored pencils, and eraser. It is helpful to also have a shading tool (blending stump or tortillon or even some tissue/toilet paper), kneaded eraser and vinyl eraser if you have them on hand. Sometimes a drawing kit will have all the necessary tools at a reduced price from buying individual pieces. Youth age 11 and younger should attend the zoom with an adult helper.
