4-H Scholarship Applications Open January 1

Past Record Books or Permanent Record Books will give you ideas on what club offices you held, community service performed, awards won, etc to help complete your scholarship applications. Washington State 4-H is pleased to offer a number of different scholarships. Currently enrolled Washington State 4-H members are eligible to apply. Applicants must have accumulated at least two years of 4-H affiliation. Previous Washington State 4-H scholarship recipients are not eligible to apply. Applicant **must** be a high school senior attending an accredited two or four-year college or university in the fall.

Washington State 4-H Scholarship Applications MUST BE COMPLETE, with submission of all five pieces included, in order be considered. Each applicant will be considered for all Washington State 4-H Scholarships. The application must be submitted by March 15 no later than 9:59 PM. These scholarships may be used at any accredited two or four-year college or university.

- Woody and Joan Bernard 4-H Scholarship \$1,000 scholarship you must plan to attend a four-year accredited educational institution or two-year vocational institution.
- Lewis County 4-H Leaders Scholarships (Two @ \$1,000, One @ \$500) you must plan to attend a two or four- year college. Applicants can be from any county in Washington State.
- O.M. Plummer Memorial Scholarship \$500 scholarship you must be attending a two or four-year college.
- Thomas R. Quann Scholarship \$1,000 scholarship you must be a current 4-H member and plan to attend a two or four-year college.
- Washington State 4-H Foundation Trustees Scholarship \$1,000 scholarship you must be a high school senior and attend a two or four-year college.
- WSU CAHNRS 4-H Scholarship \$3,000 and \$1,500 scholarships available you must have been a 4-H Club member for a least two years, a leader among your peers, and plan to attend the College of Agricultural, Human, and Natural Resource Sciences at Washington State University your freshman year.
- J. Orville/Helen Young Memorial Scholarship to be considered for this \$500 scholarship you must be a current 4-H member and plan to attend a two or four-year college.

The Washington State 4-H Dairy Endowment also offers two \$500 scholarships. The Washington State Dairy Endowment Scholarship requires a separate application from those above and is due April 1st. The Dairy Endowment offers scholarships to present or former 4-H Dairy Project members – one for a high school senior and one for a current college student. Washington State Junior Horse Show

The Washington State Junior Horse Show will be held **June 22-25**, **2023**. The WSJHS Clinic will be held on **June 22** at the Grant County Fairgrounds, Moses Lake. The WSJHS 4-H Horse Show is **June 23**, **24**, & **25**. There is also an Open WSJHS Show on **June 24** & **25**.

Animal Ownership Timelines

4-H members need to be completely enrolled (forms completed, signed and turned in to the Extension office, their Club Assessment fee paid) and their animals must be under the 4-H member's regular care and management for the following periods of time prior to the official county exhibit activity, including junior livestock shows: Rabbits and Poultry -45 days Cavies -45 days Dogs -60 days Cats -60 days Goat -60 days

Llama – 90 days Sheep and Swine (Breeding & Market) – 60 days (Swine see Rule 5C for CWJLS) Equine – 90 days (Make sure your horse certificate is on file 90 days before first show/event)

Daine On days Daine Laifer Danlage and Condens

Dairy – 90 days, Dairy Heifer Replacement– 60 days

Animals raised by the 4-H member from birth or hatching are exempt from the minimum time periods

YAKAMA CARES

Yakama Nation Legends Casino Hotel and its team members understand the importance of being good citizens to the Community and that this is paramount for good business.

We give two percent (2%) of our Class III Table Games Revenue to a Community Impact Fund. Funds are then distributed once a year by a Community Impact Fund Committee. This committee is made up of five local community government representatives. These funds have made it possible to purchase fire trucks, ambulances and police vehicles. They have also provided funds for road improvements and other community projects.

Legends Casino Hotel also has other payments for impact costs, community impacts, and charitable donations from 1% of the CIII gaming revenue machines. One half of the 1% is for charitable donations and the other half of the 1% covers the impact costs and tribal community impacts.

Applications for the non-Tribal non-profit organization can be submitted yearly to the Charitable Fund Committee from January 1 through March 31, and these funds will be distributed in May of each year. Applications need to be made in a letter format stating:

- 1. Name of Organization
- 2. What this Organization does
- 3. How much money the Organization is seeking
- 4. How this money will be utilized (spent)
- 5. A copy of a Certified Washington State Non-profit Status Form (This must be submitted with the written request. If this Non-profit Status Form is not attached, your organization's request will not be considered for funding.) 2023 application available soon. https://legendscasino.com/vakama-cares/

Volunteers: YOUR TIME MATTERS TO US.

Every hour you spend supporting 4-H is a donation.

All Certified 4-H Volunteers are required to report hours; reporting protects and supports you and the local program!

By reporting your hours you give Yakima County 4-H the numeric proof we need to show our funders and higher-officials that our programs are greatly valued and needed. In addition, reporting your hours makes you eligible for the Dept. of Labor and Industries medical aid program (this program allows an injured volunteer's medical expense to be paid by the Department of Labor and Industries), and allows you protection under the state of Washington tort claims law, RCW 4.92.060, for acts or omissions while performing, or in good faith purporting to perform, your official volunteer duties.

What qualifies as volunteer hours? Anything and everything you do for 4-H! Teaching, planning, prepping, shopping, helping at fair and other events, paperwork, training, driving, calling, mentoring, presenting, emailing, even reading this! If it's for 4-H, it counts!
