Virtual Companion Animal Challenge

The Virtual Companion Animal Challenge offers a variety of 4-H companion animal contests that don't require live animals, including an essay, art, and photography contests. Youth have the opportunity to display their companion animal knowledge through these contests.



Age Divisions

- Junior: 8 10 years of age as of October 1 of the current 4-H year
- Intermediate: 11-13 years of age as of October 1 of the current 4-H year
- Senior: 14-18 years of age as of October 1 of the current 4-H year

Categories

- Persuasive The essay should argue a point on a topic related to companion animal health, welfare, or a similar subject. The essay must take a definitive side on the argument. Examples include but are not limited to:
 - Adopting vs. buying from a breeder
 - Hamsters are the best type of pet
 - Every family should have a dog
- 2. **Informative** The essay should explore a subject related to companion animal health, welfare, or a similar subject. At least four different sources should be cited in the essay. Example topics include but are not limited to:
 - Caring for senior cats
 - Use of pets for therapy
 - o What is the energy source for fish?

Contestants & Eligibility

- 1. Entrants do not need to be enrolled in the 4-H companion animal projects. However, participants must be current enrolled 4-H members.
- 2. Only one entry per exhibitor per category permitted.
- 3. All essays are to be original works of the exhibitor and relate to companion animals. A <u>statement of authenticity</u> must be submitted with each essay.
- 4. Essays must be between 100-400 for juniors, 400-700 words for intermediate entries and 700-1000 words for senior entries.
- 5. Essays must include the writer's name, age, and club name.
- 6. Essays must be typed and in 12-point font.
- 7. Essays, along with a <u>statement of authenticity</u>, must be attached to the online entry form.
