


Upcoming Leaders' Council Meeting

Annual Financial Summaries

Annual Financial Summary Report for October 1, 2022 to September 30, 2023 were due **December 1st**. If your club does not have a checking or savings account, please make a note to that fact on the form, sign the form and return it. This submission may also be completed by emailing Katlyn at yakima.4h@wsu.edu by simply stating "____ 4-H club has no checking account". Any forms that are not completed or signed will be returned. Instructions are in the Leader's Guide to the Treasurer's Book (C1059E). If you have any questions, please contact Katlyn at the Extension office 509-574-1600.

4-H Club Bank Accounts and EINs

4-H Clubs are given non-profit status under the umbrella of the Washington State 4-H Program. 4-H clubs must be a chartered club in good standing, in order to have a bank account, to fundraise, or to accept funds or gifts and claim non-profit status for their club. To have a 4-H bank account, clubs are required to have an EIN with the IRS. New EIN applications must be completed by 4-H office staff. If your club needs an EIN, please contact Katlyn at the extension office by calling 509-574-1600. Clubs are NO longer allowed to have "shoebox accounts". Clubs are not required to have bank accounts or EINs, but learning about money is a truly valuable life skill.

- The top blue ribbon scoring individuals qualify to represent Washington State 4-H at the Eastern National 4-H Roundup in Louisville, KY in November.
- YOU should give it a try!
- The contest is held virtually. After (free) registration, you'll be assigned a presentation time. Just log into Zoom at your appointed time and give your presentation (following the guidelines outlined in the rules).

- Worried about tech challenges? We host a tech-check zoom the weekend before to help you work out all the bugs!



LIVESTOCK NEWS

Swine Regulations Identification Requirements

According to the WSDA "All swine that leave the farm of origin, moving through a public livestock market or collection facilities and all participating exhibition swine, must have official USDA-approved identification" In other words, if you buy piglets this year, the seller needs to have already applied an RFID tag when you get them. Free identification tags and applicators to Washington State Fairs & youth swine exhibitors may be attained by calling, David Hecimovich the WSDA Animal Disease Traceability Coordinator at 360-725-5493 or by email at dhecimovich@agri.wa.gov.

To request an instructional form on how to apply the applicator you may contact the Extension Office by emailing Yakima.4H@wsu.edu or by calling 509-574-1600.

Dog Pulling Event

Are you interested in training your dog on weight pulling? In February and March the International Weight Pull Association will host a sanctioned event **February 24 & 25** at the Yakima County Sundome during the Central Washington Sportsman Show. Here you could earn fun ribbons and points towards a medal near the end of the season. There is no age restriction for this event as both youth and adults are invited to participate with their dogs.

- This is <u>NOT considered a 4-H event</u> and would be held as an event from outside of our organization.
- Dogs do not need to have any registration to participate in weight pulling.
- Owner must be able to handle their dog out in public.
- Mixed breeds are allowed.

Some things to know:

- Dogs may be fixed or intact.
- No weight pulling previous training needed.
- Practice events are free of charge.
- Dogs must be over 1 year old before Feb 23rd to pull at this event.
- Recommended that dogs over 6 months old start to practice.
- Dogs can only perform up to the age of 13 years.


