- To enhance development of self-concept, character and personal growth through safe, educational and socially acceptable involvement in shooting activity.
- To teach safe and responsible use of firearms and archery equipment including sound decision making, self-discipline and concentration.
- To strengthen families through participation in life-long recreational activities.
- To complement and enhance the impact of existing safety, shooting and hunter education programs using experiential education methods and progressive development of skills and abilities.

Use this record book to record all that you do in 4-H this year in your <u>main</u> project (usually the project you spend the most time on). Separate each section of the book with labeled tabbed divider pages and put in a 3-ring binder. You may type or hand-write your book. Seniors are to use pen. Indicate the year as 20__/_ to reflect the 4-H year. Do not leave blank pages. Write NONE if no activity.

Record Books MUST be the work of the 4-H member.

<u>Section 1:</u> Cover Page, fill out all sections. Your 4-H age is how old you are on Oct 1 of the current 4-H year.

Section 2: 4-H Calendar, Oct 1- Sept 30

Record your clubs events and activities for the year. Include Fairs, contests, Super Saturday, county events, etc., as well as club/project activities and community service projects. Indicate if you attended with an X and a 0 if not attended. If doing more than 1 project use this calendar for all 4-H project activities.

<u>Section 3:</u> Main Project Include in the following order:

Project Commitment Page: Your goal(s)

Signed agreement between you, your project leader, and your parent. Needs to be done at the beginning of the 4-H year. Goals should be specific. Intermediate and Senior members are required to list 3 goals.

Use goals that fit the SMART goal model. Specific Measurable Achievable Relevant Time-Bound

Shooting Records:

This is where you will keep a log of practice and competition shooting events. Only use the pages for the firearms you are shooting. It is ok to leave the other pages blank.

Hunting Trips Record:

Record your hunting trips even if you did not harvest an animal.
