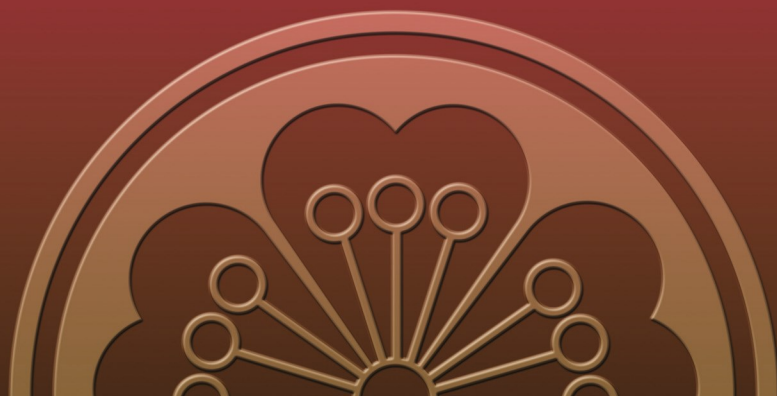


FREE GARDENING TALKS 2019
