## POSTER CRICUT LETTERING EVENT

Pierce County 4-H now has several Cricut 3 and Explorer 3 machines for cutting letters and images from a variety of media. Heather Wroe will be offering instructions on how to use the machine on Saturday, May 6<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am at the 4-H Office, 3602 Pacific Avenue. At 10:00 am we will have leaders who can help members cut letters for their project posters for the Fair. Having letters cut by a Cricut machine for your poster will improve the look of your poster and could help raise a red to a blue ribbon. We will have colored cardstock paper available. We will be offering a poster laminating day on June 17th at the 4-H Office, 10:00am—2:00pm. There is no charge for laminating or Cricut materials.

Cricut machines are now available for clubs to check out.

## **ANIMAL REGISTRATION**

Members in animal projects planning to participate in the Pierce County Fair or Qualifying Shows will need to enter their animal(s) into 4HOnline. Different animals have different deadlines. You can access the Animal entry page from your 4HOnline profile.

Each animal type has different required information. Some animals have fields that have been changed to include information Pierce County Superintendents will need for fair. Alternate field titles are found under the entry box. One of these is for horse members to enter their back numbers in the Registration Number box. For doags the Breed is for AKC Class Name and Breeder Location is for Breed. For certain animals, members will also be able to upload one or two photos and a certificate for some of their animals into 4HOnline. Horse members are required to enter a photo of their horse.
