Interviews with the scholarship committee will be scheduled through 4Honline in the following two weeks. Scholarships will be presented at the Pierce County Fair.

In 2024, the Pierce County 4-H Leaders Council scholarship program will align with the Washington State 4-H scholarship timeline. Applications will be due in March, which will allow recipients to be recognized before the end of the school year.

LOOKING FOR ADULTS TO WORK WITH YOUTH AT BOTH ENDS OF OUR AGE RANGE

Are you good working with teens or five- to seven-year-olds? If this is not you but you know someone that would be great, let the 4-H Office know their contact information and we will contact them directly. These do not need to be currently approve volunteers, but they need to be willing to become certified 4-H volunteers.

We are looking for volunteers to help advise the Teen Leaders program. This position is mentoring teen leaders to build a program that includes teens from around Pierce County. This program is not meant to replace their primary club, but add an additional opportunity for leadership development, socialize with other teens, and give back to the community.

The second position is working with Cloverbuds. This position would help to plan a program for Cloverbuds and their parents. This person will work with Cloverbud parents to plan and run activities. We are looking at both in-person and zoom programs to supplement what they are working on in their clubs.

The Pierce County Leaders Council invites all youth to an open Cavy, Rabbit, and Poultry show on June 10, 2023 at Frontier Park, 21606 Meridian E, Graham, WA 98338. The show will take place in the Rabbit Barn at the back of the park near the large parking lot.

Rabbits and Cavies will begin at 9:00 a.m. with Poultry following at 11:00 a.m. The show will include showman-ship and judging. The fee is \$10 per animal payable at the door. The funds generated by the Fun'Raiser go toward grants and scholarships for Pierce County 4-H Members.

S.T.E.M OPPORTUNITIES AT FAIR

4-H members enrolled in a S.T.E.M. related project have a challenge to meet at the Pierce County Fair to show that you have mastery of your project.

There are multiple opportunities for showing your S.T.E.M. skills

- Enter individual exhibits that you have created this year in the S.T.E.M. Department.
- Take on the S.T.E.M. Showcase in the S.T.E.M. Events Department. The S.T.E.M. Showcase which involves an interactive STEM skills presentation of at least 20 minutes as an individual or as a group. Exhibitors also need to design at least one handout for the general public.
- The S.T.E.M. Challenge is a set of four different challenges including 3-D Printing, Stop Motion Photography, Squishy Circuits, and 3Doodlers. Exhibitors can try one or more of the challenges. There will be a set time limit for the completion of each project determined by the judge prior to starting.

VIRTUAL HERDSMANSHIP

A good way to share your personal 4-H story is to enter the Virtual Herdsmanship class offered in all animal departments. If your entry is complete, it will earn you 10 premium points. You can only enter once per department.

Upload a photo of you with your animal and a word or PDF document with the following information:

- Introduction with first name, club name, and years in 4-H
- A little about your animal
- A little about your experience in 4-H

ACCOMMODATION DOCUMENT

If 4-H members have documented physical, emotional, or mental issue, the family can submit a request for reasonable accommodation. The request must be on the <u>current form</u>. Once the accommodation is approved you will receive a letter that will inform the superintendent and judges of the accommodation needs. If you have received an accommodation in the past, check to see if it is up to date. If it is not up to date submit a new form to receive an updated letter.
