July 31st is the last day to enroll in 4-H for the 2022/2023 program year. If you try to enroll after 10:00pm on July 31st you will receive an error message. 4HOnline will be unavailable until it reopens on October 1st for the new program year. We will mail a commemorative patch to the first 500 youth and adults to enroll for the new year. The patch design will debut at the Exhibitor Otter Pop Socials at the Pierce County Fair.
