ANIMALS



Now is the time for members to start entering and recertifying their animals in 4HOnline. For existing animals, all that is needed is to check the information, correct it if necessary, and then resubmit it. New animals need to be entered and submitted. Doing this now will make sure that your animals are ready when you need them for shows and Fair. Horse and Beef

animal entries require a photo be uploaded to 4HOnline before submitting. Some other animals have a space for photos to be uploaded but are not required. Dog and Pet members should upload a photo for help with assigning space at the Pierce County Fair.

MARKET SALES

If you are planning to participate in the Market Sale at the Pierce County Fair next August, you will need to start working on your project now. You are able to enter two different animal species in the Market Sale. If a member is in 4-H and FFA, they may not use the same animal in both organization but are able to use two different animals of the same species. Animals must be entered into 4HOnline prior to the animal type deadline or entry into the Pierce County Fair, whichever comes first. You will need to complete and enter an Educational Display (poster or display). You are required to turn in two record books, the Market Livestock Record and either the 4-H Record Book Level 1 or Level 2 (see the links below). Don't forget to enter your volunteer hours through 12/31/2023!

According to WSU Policy, all 4-H leaders **must** enter their volunteer hours into the GivePulse system at least quarterly. By entering your volunteer hours, you are covered by WSU liability and Washington State L & I Insurance. If hours are not entered consistently, the State does not see you as an active volunteer in the program and may not cover you with insurance if there is an accident or incident.

KNOW YOUR GOVERNMENT—TEEN CONFERENCE

This year Know Your Government returns to Olympia, February 17-19, 2024. Each county sends a delegation that has met several times prior to the conference. The cost has not been announced, but each delegate (ages 14-18) is able to request a grant from the Pierce County Leaders Council for up to \$300. This year, participants will explore political parties and the nomination process. During pre-conference orientation, participants will learn about different political parties, the nomination process, the development of resolutions that support planks that make up a party platform, and how to use parliamentary procedure when conducting a meeting. At the conference in February, delegates will nominate a KYG party candidate and finalize a KYG party platform to share with legislators at the Legislative Dinner on the final evening of the conference.

From pre-conference county meetings and conference participation, delegates will learn all or some of the

following:

- •Discover the purpose of political parties
- •Identify parties that exist and what differentiates them
- •Discuss what influences parties
- •Learn and practice parliamentary procedure
- •Learn about different voting systems and practice instant run-off voting and the electoral college
- •Learn how to get a candidate elected through building support among peers
- •Develop a platform by identifying issues of importance to youth and create resolutions to support those platform planks
- •Strengthen focused life skills: Collaboration, Positive Civil Discourse/Conflict Resolution, Positive Citizenship
