FUN'Raiser

The 4-H Leaders Council FUN'Raiser is the only fund raiser that raises funds for Opportunity Grants for youth, leaders, and projects. Each Pierce County 4-H member is able to request a grant to help cover fees for county, state, and national training and development events. Certified 4-H leaders can receive grants to chaperone 4-H groups, attend project and program training. Projects can also receive grants to improve their county level program. In the last few years, the cat, cavy and rabbit projects received grants to purchase new cages.

Monies raised also goes to college scholarships. Each year the Council provides \$250-\$750 scholarships for up to four high school seniors for technical, community, and university tuition

FUN'Raisers shows are open to the public and each have different start times and entry fees. Check with the WSU Pierce 4-H website for forms. Forms are also attached to this newsletter for the April show. The 2024 FUN'Raisers will be held on April 27th for Cat, Dog, and Horse projects and June 8th for Cavy, Rabbit, and Poultry projects. The FUN'Raisers will all be held at Frontier Park in Graham.

PROGRAM ZOOM

The next 4-H Program Zoom will be held on February 22nd, at 7:00pm. Program zooms are a chance for members, leaders, and parents to come together and get answers of various topics. There is a specific monthly topic, but time is always allotted to answer questions and give program updates. We try to keep the time to 45 minutes.
