


Welcome. This video is designed to help parents, parent leaders, and other members of the community understand Preschool Promise and how to apply.




Preschool Promise is a free program held at different locations in the Salem-Keizer area. For the 2020-2021 school year, those locations are: Bethel School, Chapman Hill Elementary, Clear Lake Elementary, Hallman Elementary, Richmond Elementary, and Seymour Center. A link is provided to the Salem-Keizer early childhood education website, so you can determine the locations in subsequent years. Each classroom is staffed with a teacher and instructional assistant. Each class serves 20 children. Bus transportation to and from the programs is available whenever possible. Marion & Polk Early Learning Hub monitors Preschool Promise programs and reports to the Early Learning Division.



To be eligible for Preschool Promise, children must be 3 or 4 years old by the kindergarten eligibility date of September 10<sup>th</sup> in Salem and September 1<sup>st</sup> in other areas. Proof of age must be provided in the form of a birth certificate, hospital record, or immunization record.

Families must also be Oregon residents. Proof of residency can be provided in the form of a current utility or service bill, Oregon driver's license, or other identification card.



Income verification can be completed by providing income tax form 1040 or 1040A OR 12 months worth of pay stubs OR Form W-2 from all employers OR documentation of foster care status.

Additional income that should be included consists of: child support or alimony payments, unemployment income, Social Security, pensions, or other retirement income, Supplemental Social Security (SSI), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), worker's compensation, Veteran's benefits, insurance or annuity payments, scholarships/grants/stipends, dividends/interest, rental income, other periodic income sources.

You do not need to count income from Federal stimulus payments, capital gains, tax refunds, gifts or loans, one-time insurance benefits, non-cash benefits such as employer-paid health insurance, food or housing received in lieu of wages, non-cash assistance such as Medicaid, SNAP, school meals, or housing.


Please note that if you do not have copies of the required documents, there are alternate ways to certify birthdate, address, and income. Please contact the Marion & Polk Early Learning Hub.

In order to qualify for Preschool Promise, families must have incomes less than 200% of federal poverty guidelines. That number can be found on this chart. To determine eligibility, find family size in the left-hand column, and follow the appropriate row to the right-hand column. For example, a family of 4 must have income less than \$52,400 per year.

Please take a moment to find the maximum income for your family size and make sure that you meet the requirements.

Please feel free to pause the video now to determine income eligibility and gather all required documents. Next, we will review the application process.



A link to the Preschool Promise application is provided in this toolkit. If you have not done so already, please pause the video and print out the application. We will go through each section of the application together.

The first section on the first page is to be filled out if your child is already enrolled at preschool site that is being converted to Preschool Promise. If this does not apply to you, simply leave it blank or mark "n/a". The next section is where you will enter information about the child.

First, enter the child's name, date of birth, and gender.

Then select your child's primary language.

Then select all languages spoken in the home.

Next, select the child's race and ethnicity. Select all that apply.

Next, answer "Do you consider your family to be homeless".


The wording of this question is a little misleading. By answering this question, you are simply helping the school district determine if your housing situation qualifies you for assistance. Please don't feel judged or embarrassed.

Homelessness for this purpose is defined as lacking a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence including:

- sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason (This can include living with family members.)
- living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to the lack of alternative adequate accommodations
- living in emergency or transitional shelter
- · abandoned in hospitals
- awaiting foster care placement
- staying in a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings
- living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings
- migratory children who are living in circumstances described above.

Then mark whether or not your family has an Individual Family Service Plan to support your child's development.

Next, mark whether or not your child has any other health, nutrition, behavioral, or mental health concern that requires specialized supports. If marking yes, list any healthcare providers you would like the preschool to know about.



The next section begins parent information. You will provide information about you as the parent or guardian, or if assisting someone else, you will enter the information about the parent or guardian of the child.

Begin this section by entering your name and relationship to the child. Next, select the percentage of time the child resides with you. Then enter your phone number and/or email address for contact information.

For the last part of this section, you will mark whether you are employed part time or full time, a student, unemployed, a business owner, or other employment status.

If there are two parents or guardians in the family, you will repeat the same process for the "Parent/Guardian 2 Information" section. If not, you may leave this section blank and proceed to the signature section.



The final section to complete is your signature and date. By signing you are agreeing to the statement:
