Kei truck mania is sweeping WSU facilities on campus! By Stacey Trevino

You may have already seen that the Grounds department and Housing have these mini trucks added to their work truck fleet.

Kei class truck or Japanese mini truck is a type of pickup truck available in two-wheel drive and fourwheel drive versions built to satisfy the Japanese keijidosha statutory class.

Keijidosha means "light automobile" refers to the Japanese vehicle category for the smallest highway legal passenger cars with restricted dimensions and engine capacity.

We at the Grounds department have had one for almost a year now and have two additional trucks being

implemented to our department. The super small trucks are perfect for maneuvering around the sidewalk system of campus with ease. Getting into areas that make it easy for distribution or removal of materials with ease.

Their quiet design also means they keep disruption to a minimum.

The dump bed and plow attachment capabilities are some added bonuses that will make it efficient for all of grounds plant beds, turf maintenance and snow moving and removal options.

Diahatsu Hijet models are what grounds is running and it has proven to be most efficient for our needs with being able to access areas without having to drive on the lawns and when we have to, it minimizes the wear on the turf when the conditions are good for that. The bed can hold quite the loads of leaves, grass clippings and branches or bush trimmings. We are also looking at getting ramps that double as side rails for either extra-large load hauls or ramps to move in lawnmowers or other small equipment to the bed. We are looking forward to having them plow some snow areas and



carry tanks for spraying or water distribution.

If you see us around campus in these trucks, just know it is all around fun to drive. In my own opinion, I feel very happy driving them and want to wave to everyone staring like I am in a parade!


