COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This core course focuses on the development of clinical management methods for use by family nurse practitioners in providing primary care to individuals across the lifespan with emphasis on the assessment and management of individuals and family with acute and common conditions. Students will advance understanding of core concepts related to acute care issues in diverse populations, and will build on interprofessional collaborative practice principles.
