Season Hoard is an outstanding program evaluator and a brilliant methodologist who leads interdisciplinary research into complex policy problems. The author of 30 policy papers for the state, her analyses have led to improvements in policing, housing, telehealth, alternative jet fuel supply, and more. Her recommendations to the EPA and USDA are improving national food systems planning as well as the "Local Foods, Local Places" program.

Her systemic international study of the impact of gender expertise, practices, and recommendations was one of the first of its kind. With a growing body of peer-reviewed papers, she is a highly sought authority on gender equality issues such as electoral financing, community engagement, and policy evaluation.

A dedicated teacher, she creates opportunities for students to translate concepts and methodologies into action by simulating electoral processes, creating educational videos for their peers, and conducting research.

She is chair of the President's Commission on the Status of Women, regularly aids with unitlevel DEI assessments, and has supervised 14 Honors theses.

Season's intellectual curiosity and commitment to transformative change is expanding engagement with agencies and communities across the Pacific Northwest.
