Justification for Changes:

- 1. EM 564-No change, remains the same as the current requirement
- 2. EM 501 has been deleted and EM 522 remains as the requirement. The graduate faculty has voted to delete EM 501 from the ETM curriculum and retain only EM 522. There is considerable duplication of content in EM 501 and EM 522 so EM 522 will be retained as a course in the curriculum.
- 3. EM 508 has been moved to an alternative course in No. 4 as EM 508 has limited attendance and has been removed from the ETM core course selections. Because of the increasing challenges mentioned in the description above, risks have become a major influence in making project management decisions and therefore EM 568 has been added as a required course for the certificate rather than an alternative.
- 4. EM 520 and EM 530 have been deleted from the ETM curriculum due to a lack of enrollment and is therefore being deleted from the certificate. EM 568 has been moved to No. 3 as a required course (see 3. Above). EM 508 and EM 505 are selectives that allow a student to choose content to supplement their work knowledge or prepare for working in legal or finance areas of Project Management hence they have been added as two of the alternatives for the certificate. Since EM 534 is no longer a part of the ETM

curriculum the subject matter has been incorporated into EM 570 which provides a holistic set of modern tools for use available to the project manager in meeting the cost, schedule, and performance requirements of managing a project.
