This program prepares students for new and emerging research techniques in business behavior research. To complete the certificate, students must complete 15 credits consisting of three core courses and two additional electives with a GPA of 2.5 or better. Educational Leadership, Sport Studies, and Educational/Counseling Psychology Revise certification and graduation requirements for Bachelor of Arts in Sport Management	Sport Management (120 Hours) WSU seeks to prepare the best possible sport management professionals and therefore seeks highly qualified individuals. Admission to, or continued enrollment in the sport management program may be denied to any candidate who does not meet the minimum criteria. Applicants who meet the minimum requirements are <u>eligible for consideration</u> , but not assured admission. Enrollment is limited and admission competitive. Application for admission opens mid-semester and deadline for application submission is the Friday before finals week, with certification effective the following term.
