In 2013, the merger of the old degrees (Environmental Science, Geology, and NATRS) took place. At that time, the name of the degree was put forward by the Registrar's Office as the BS in Earth and Environmental Science (see next page). Unfortunately, the name on the memo did not include the 's' in 'Sciences' and therefore did not match the paperwork that was submitted by the School.

Having confirmed the name of the degree with the Director of the School of the Environment, Kent Keller, and the Associate Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, Ana Maria Rodriquez-Vivaldi, I respectfully request that the name be corrected.

Effective fall 2018, the name of the degree will be the Bachelor of Science in Earth and Environmental Sciences.

Science, Geology, and Natural Resource Sciences, and create a degree

of the Bachelor of Science in Earth and Environmental Science

This memo is to enter into the record that AAC approved a proposal to merge the Bachelor of Science degrees in Environmental Science, Geology, and Natural Resource Sciences, and create a degree of the Bachelor of Science in Earth and Environmental Science.

The proposal was reviewed and approved by Catalog Subcommittee, and was subsequently presented and approved as part of the Undergraduate and Professional Major Change Bulletin No. 5 by AAC on November 16, 2012. It was then approved by the Faculty Senate on February 14, 2013.

The degree will be comprised on three majors:

- 1. Wildlife Ecology and Conservation Sciences (Pullman only), with two options:
 - Basic Plan
 - Pre-vet Plan
- 2. Earth Sciences (Pullman only)
- 3. Environmental and Ecosystem Sciences (Pullman, Tri-Cities, and Vancouver)

Attached are the documents that were initially reviewed and approved by Catalog Subcommittee with the signatures from the chair and deans.

Following any other internal approvals and review by the ICAPP, the new degree will be entered into the university catalog and made available to students for program certification.
