## WSU College of Nursing Master of Nursing in Advance Population Health and Post-Master's Certificates

### Rationale for Name Change of Advanced Population Health to Population Health

The Population Health Faculty (formerly known as Advanced Population Health (APH) Faculty unanimously voted August 25, 2014 to change our program name to Population Health (dropping the "advanced.") Although our graduates at both the Master's and Doctoral levels have advanced expertise in population health, the term advanced population health was ambiguous. Potential students asked if we meant "geriatrics" or whether our population of study was "advanced in age?"

Recent policy and publications including the Affordable Care Act and the Institute of Medicine's publication, the *Future of Nursing* (2011), use the term population health extensively. The faculty have agreed that we will discuss our programs as: 1) a Master's of Nursing in Population Health or 2) a Doctor of Nursing Practice in Population Health. Further specifics defining our three tracks will result in titling as follows:

- Master's of Nursing in Population Health-Educator
- Master's of Nursing in Population Health-Leadership
- Master's of Nursing in Population Health-Individualized Option
- DNP in Population Health

### Rationale for Change in Nursing Leadership Certificate:

Like the name change in our program, the change in the Nursing Leadership Certificate was voted upon by the population health faculty and supported by the College of Nursing's Graduate Curriculum and Progression Committee. The changes in the leadership certificate are consistent with the changes in the leadership track of our Population Health MN program and reflect:

- Current AACN (American Association of Colleges of Nursing) MN and DNP Essentials
- AONE (American Organization of Nurse Executives) competencies
- Curricular research conducted by population health faculty members (Relevant Nursing Leadership: An Evidence-Based Programmatic Response; 2009)

#### Rationale for Change in Nurse Educator Certificate:

Similarly the changes in the Nurse Educator Certificate program were voted upon by the population health faculty and supported by the College of Nursing's curricular oversight committee, GPCP. The changes in the nurse educator certificate are consistent with the changes in the nurse educator track of our Population Health MN program and reflect:

- Current AACN (American Association of Colleges of Nursing) MN and DNP Essentials
- NLN (National League for Nursing) competencies
- Curricular research conducted by nurse educator faculty and masters students (Finding Safety and Authenticity: Becoming a Transformative Nurse Educator, presented 2014).
