Rationale for two Major Curricular Changes to the Ph.D. degree in History

As the most recent faculty member to teach History 595, I proposed, to our department, an increase in the number of credit hours for the course. The course had been taught as a two-credit course for several years, having been increased from one credit in the not distant past (but before my time at WSU). I saw two problems with the course being less than three credits. First, two credits suggested the course was less significant, to students and faculty, than other courses. Second, full time faculty were unable to teach the course on-load. An increase to three credits heightens the pedagogical value and professional profile of the course for students. Additionally, staffing options are far greater at three credits as the course will no longer have to be staffed by adjuncts or as an overload for full time faculty. The proposal was accepted by our department and has the endorsement of our Graduate Studies committee.

Therefore, we request a change to History 595 in the course catalog from two credits to three.

To account for this change in the overall degree, we propose a shift of one credit hour away from the History 800 credits and toward the History 595 requirement. Currently, a Ph.D. degree requires 22 credit hours of dissertation (History 800), a peculiar number indivisible by three to account for the fact that 595 was only two credits. Reducing the 800 requirement to 21 total credits, and increasing 595 by one credit to a total of three, avoids the need to change the number of credits of the overall Ph.D. degree, and leaves the overall number of credits of 72 cleanly divisible by three credits, as all graduate history classes are.
