Background/rationale for this change:

Presently (effective Fall 2011), the Plant Pathology program presently requires 2 seminar graded credits (PLP 515) for both the master and doctoral programs—both on topical subjects other than the student's *dissertation*. The students are also required to give a non-credit exit seminar, in association with their final exam.

There has been some discussion that last change to the seminar requirement (Fall 2011) was intended for PhD students only—as evidenced by the word 'dissertation' (highlighted above), but in practice was applied to both MS and PhD students. The Plant Pathology faculty have recently discussed the current seminar requirement in relation to the short duration of an MS degree, and strongly support reducing the graded seminar requirement (PLP 515) for Master's students to 1 topical seminar graded credit (vs 2)—on a topic other than the student's thesis. Master's students will still be required to give a non-credit exit seminar, in association with their final exam. This arrangement will help with some of the need to double up or even triple up on seminars weekly towards the end of each semester.

Graduate students who started their program under the existing requirements of two PI P 515 credits will be given the option of following the current requirements, or adopting the new requirements. We will ask their preference be made in writing and submitted to our program's Academic Coordinator for inclusion in their program file.
