This provides preparation for careers in private, governmental, and non-profit accounting. The prerequisite courses from the first two years will cover the lower division UCORE requirements as a Direct Transfer Associates (DTA) degree. An additional BSCI or PSCI lab course is required for the major, and will not be satisfied by the DTA degree. The social work advisor and program director will individually assess whether course work taken will meet the content requirements of SOCL WRK 101, 201, and 202. If so, these courses will be waived. If not, the student is required to fulfill these requirements before being formally admitted to the social work program. <br> Prerequisites include 6 student selected credits in social work or human development which may be satisfied with social science and humanities courses in DTA degree if courses are in social work and/or human development.
