ARCYBER BY THE NUMBERS

Operations around the world, around the clock:

- ▶ Global defensive, offensive and network operations
- ▶ \$1.5 billion annual budget
- ▶ Approximately 6,500 Soldiers and 10,000 civilian employees and contractors
- ▶ Five worldwide Regional Cyber Centers
- ▶ 41 cyber teams in the active force
- ▶ 21 additional cyber teams being built by the Army's reserve component forces

The 16,500 uniformed and civilian men and women of ARCYBER deliver offensive and defensive cyberspace effects and network operations 24/7, defending critical DoD data, networks and weapons systems and empowering Army and joint force combatant commanders and maneuver elements around the globe.

THE ROAD TO FORT GORDON



ARCYBER elements previously spread across three Army installations in three states consolidated into state-of-the-art facilities at Fort Gordon, Ga., in 2020. Fortitude Hall, the command's headquarters:

- ▶ Serves as the focal point for ARCYBER's global operations
- ▶ Provides a base for institutional cyber training, establishes closer integration with Army Cyber Mission Force teams, and positions ARCYBER next to key partners that enhance its operations
- ▶ Increases Army readiness and technological superiority in the midst of changing threats, terrain and technology
- ▶ Enhances operational efficacy by establishing a single operations center for HQ ARCYBER and JFHQ-Cyber
- ▶ Drives progress, innovation and partnerships for ARCYBER, the Cyber Center of Excellence, Fort Gordon, the Army and the nation
