## PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING OVERALL REQUIREMENTS

- 1) Half of the credits required for the minor must be in upper-division courses.
- 2) A minimum of 9 credits with a letter grade must be taken in residency at WSU, of which 3 must be at the 300-400 level.
- 3) 101-102 is the WSU language requirement and cannot count toward the minor.
- 4) Conversation courses (105, 205, 305) do not count toward the minor.
- 5) Only courses thus designated in the Catalog may be repeated for credit toward the minor.
- 6) All courses must be passed with a grade of C or better.
- 7) Courses counting towards a minor in the language may not also be counted towards a major in International Area Studies (i.e. Latin America Area Studies, German Area Studies, or French and Francophone Area Studies).
- 8) For courses taken in Study Abroad programs or as other transfer credits, please check with your advisor.
- 9) For the special requirements concerning French and Francophone options in the French Area Studies Minor, and concerning Spanish Peninsular and Latin American options in the Spanish language minor, please see your language area advisors.

### FOR EXAMPLE:

Take FREN 102 (Second Semester French) & get a B or better  
Earn 4 credits for 102 PLUS 4 AP credits for FREN 101  
TOTAL 8 credits

Take FREN 203 (Third Semester French) & get a B or better  
Earn 4 credits for 203 PLUS 4 AP credits for FREN 102  
PLUS 4 AP credits for FREN 101  
TOTAL 12 credits

Take FREN 204 (Fourth Semester French) & get a B or better  
Earn 4 credits for 204 PLUS 4 AP credits for FREN 203  
PLUS 4 AP credits for FREN 102  
TOTAL 12 credits

Take FREN 307 (Fourth Semester French) & get a B or better  
Earn 4 credits for 204  
PLUS 4 AP credits for FREN 203  
PLUS 1 AP credit for FREN 305  
TOTAL 12 credits
