Most students take 6 years to complete the program; students entering with a master's degree may complete the program in 5 years, inclusive of internship.

Students who had completed a prior empirical master's thesis may be able to waive the thesis requirement, pending approval by two thesis readers.

**Note.** Amounts shown are for first **full year** (12 months) in the program. In-residence students are full-time only. Graduate student health insurance is provided by WSU at no charge. All incoming students receive a 20-hour graduate assistantship with a tuition waiver and a 9-month stipend of \$15,331.50 for pre-master's students (\$16,272.00 for post-master's students). Summer employment in the department also is available for most students. Based on Washington state law, students are required to contribute \$972 per semester toward residual tuition and fees.

**\*Based 10 to 18 credit hours each semester in Fall and Spring. Waivers are applied in conjunction with a 20-hour graduate assistantship.**
