

The MIT Program is an intense 1 year master's program. Along with your master's degree, you will leave the program as a certified teacher.

It includes:

- 1. Coursework: June 2024-July 2025**
- 2. School-based internship/mentoring (fall and spring semester)**
- 3. Master's Inquiry Project**



MIT Application Overview

1. Apply to GradCas (Priority Deadline Nov. 15)

- Resume
- 3 references
- Personal statements (follow prompts in GradCas or [here](#)).
- Relevant teaching/mentoring experiences
- Official transcripts (only non-WSU)

2. Interview (mid January)

3. Preliminary Admission

4. Full Admission

Note: This is the only application; there is no separate application for the College of Education anymore (previously there was).



Are there any required tests?

Basic Skills. If you have (*or will have*) a bachelor's degree and have taken the ACT, SAT, or [West-B](#) in all three subject areas (reading, writing, and math), you have met this requirement.

Content Knowledge. By April 1, candidates need to have taken a content exam associated their endorsement area, such as the [NES exam](#).



What does the MIT program look like?

Summer 2024: 4 courses (12 credits)

Fall 2024: 6 courses; 2 school days (18 credits)

Spring 2025: 5 school days; 2 evening courses (13 credits)

Summer 2025: 2 courses; Master's Project (9 credits)
