



Did you know that in most cases, you could earn internship credit?

* CAS 497

- provides students with an opportunity to obtain academic credit for experiential activities as a paid or unpaid intern in business, education, nonprofit, industry or government organizations.
- is a variable credit course (2-16 credits) and students must have Junior Standing (60 credits). The course may be repeated for credit up to a maximum of 16 credits. A maximum of 6 credits may be applied to the Humanities and Social Sciences major degree program.

Undergraduate Research Assistant Opportunity

Are you interested in doing research looking at body cam footage of police and community interactions and have those credits count toward your degree?

The Department of Criminal Justice and Criminology is looking for students for their **Complex Social Interactions Bodycam Research Lab** for the fall semester. Selected students will work with Dr. Makin and two Graduate Research Assistants on a research project conducting content analysis of police and community interactions. Research students will be coding and analyzing bodycam footages of law enforcement officers as they interact with the public. Students must be willing to work in a physical lab on campus throughout the fall semester. Please note, participation in the lab is **contingent upon having your fingerprinted and passing a background check**.

If approved, you will be enrolled in **Crm J 499** (Independent Research) with credits going toward your degree. Credit varies for Crm J 499 and students can choose to enroll **up to 4 credits** for the course. Working research hours are flexible upon completing the mandatory trainings/meetings. To be considered, **students must have completed a research methods course (i.e., Crm J 311, HD**

310, Soc 320, Soc 317 or Psych 312) before the start of fall semester with at least a cum GPA of 3.0 or higher. Between our returning students and newly selected, we hope to have up to forty students for this lab. To apply, please use this link
