



Neuropsychology is a specialization of clinical psychology that focuses on the relationship between brain and behavior. A neuropsychologist works with an individual experiencing issues from memory problems, thinking, concentration, changes in personality, perception, or language production, and comprehension. A neuropsychologist evaluates behavioral and cognitive changes that are from central nervous system disease or injury.

Enroll on time...


Check your enrollment date and resolve holds to ensure you register on time. Delayed enrollment can lead to a delayed degree...
