- 3. Submit your thesis as a Word- or pdf-document + signed advisor form to <a href="mailto:honors@wsu.edu">honors@wsu.edu</a> on or before the deadline listed above.

**NOTE:** To qualify for a <u>nomination for Pass with Distinction</u> your Honors thesis must be presented by **Monday, November 13, 2020.** 

## PRESENTATION FORMATS VIA ZOOM

Following approval of your presentation date and time Honors will email Zoom meeting information to student, advisor and evaluator.

## **POSTER PRESENTATION:**

The Honors thesis may be presented as a poster during the Honors Thesis Poster Presentation session. Share poster slide on screen while presenting. Following presentation and Q/A, the thesis advisor, evaluator, and Honors host will discuss and evaluate the thesis and presentation in a breakout room.

#### TRADITIONAL THESIS PRESENTATION

**Duration:** 1 hour | Presentations begin on the hour and are run between 9am through 4pm
